

Proposal to change the LLB Dress code.

Rationale: It has become increasingly difficult for members especially the ladies to get Tailored garments to play in which is what the LLB dress code currently stipulates must be worn. Following discussions at the last two meetings the following is the proposed new wording which should allow for more freedom of choice when purchasing clothing to play in, whilst maintaining the standards of dress which is required to ensure teams continue to represent their clubs, themselves and the league adequately.

The LLB Dress standard remains unchanged, it states that the LLB dress code must be always observed, the proposed new wording for the LLB Dress Code is listed below.

Ladies:

White Blouses, Polo Shirts or similar tops may be worn, they can be sleeveless but must contain a collar. If their club has opted to adopt a coloured club shirt which has been registered with the Secretary of the LLB then this can be worn. If club shirts are being worn then they must be worn by every member of the team.

White skirts, shorts, skorts or trousers can be worn. It is the responsibility of the club they are representing to police the standards of the garments being worn and to ensure they maintain the standards of appearance required at all times. If the club accepts the garments as being suitable then the opposition team members should do so as well. Drawstring and elasticated waist trousers are acceptable as long as they conform to the LLB Dress Code ref Colour. If a club wishes to play in coloured garments below the waist then the colour of choice must be registered with the LLB secretary. All players within the team must wear the same colour when playing

Garments with large external patch pockets are not allowed and Must Not be worn

Gentlemen:

White shirts or Polo Shirts may be worn, They must have sleeves and a collar. If their club has opted to adopt a coloured club shirt which has been registered with the Secretary of the LLB then this can be worn. If club shirts are being worn then they must be worn by every member of the team.

White shorts or trousers can be worn. It is the responsibility of the club they are representing to police the standards of the garments being worn and to ensure they maintain the standards of appearance required at all times. If the club accepts the garments as being suitable then the opposition team members should do so as well. Drawstring and elasticated waist trousers are acceptable as long as they conform to the LLB Dress Code ref Colour.
